As a parent of a home-school child of high school age, I understand that home-based instruction is in lieu of enrollment in public school. Therefore, my child may not receive credit or be granted a diploma from Sumner High School or Bonney Lake High School as a result of home-school work. In order to receive credit for home-school work, the home-school work must meet Washington State and Sumner School District requirements for credit. The guidelines include, but are not limited to, those set forth below:

The guidelines for granting credit for home-school courses are defined in Sumner School District Policy 3112. For a home-school course of study to be considered for high school credit, the student is responsible to provide the following:

- A journal/portfolio of the actual work completed during the home-study course. Exhibits, performance based or otherwise, of specific course-related projects should be included.
- In addition, to be considered for credit, the student shall demonstrate proficiency (at a minimum of 80%) of the student learning objectives of the course.
- The burden of providing these materials and demonstrating proficiency shall be upon the student.

Upon receipt of these materials, school officials will review and make a determination if the course meets Washington State and Sumner School District credit requirements, and if so, the type and amount of credits to be awarded. Home-school courses posted to a Sumner High School or Bonney Lake High School transcript will not carry a letter grade, but a P indicating a passing mark.
